Abstract

Gender discrimination is definitely byproducts of traditional attitude/behavior/practice of Community. Every people treat his or her children as wealth especially the daughters are seen as symbol of social decorum. As a result, the children are forgetting their childhood and daughters are becoming victims of different forms of violence, with in the four walls or outside. The reverse situation resulting into un- protective and completely a negative environment for children especially girls. Irresponsibility and lack of social commitment develop fertile ground for heterogeneous features of exploitation and violence against children especially girls.

Bhoomika take the situation as social ill that cannot be cured without paying social responsibilities and bringing change to traditional practices. With this concern, Bhoomika team always works for social change involving absolutely the local and effected communities. The motto of our effort is to bring forward the vulnerable and effected communities for spontaneous thinking and initiates.
